7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for Safe Handling

Use in a well ventilated area. DO NOT store or use in confined spaces. Build up of mists or vapours in the atmosphere must be prevented. Avoid breathing in mists or vapours. Do not use near welding or other ignition sources and avoid sparks. Do not smoke. Wear appropriate protection. Conditions for Safe Storage
